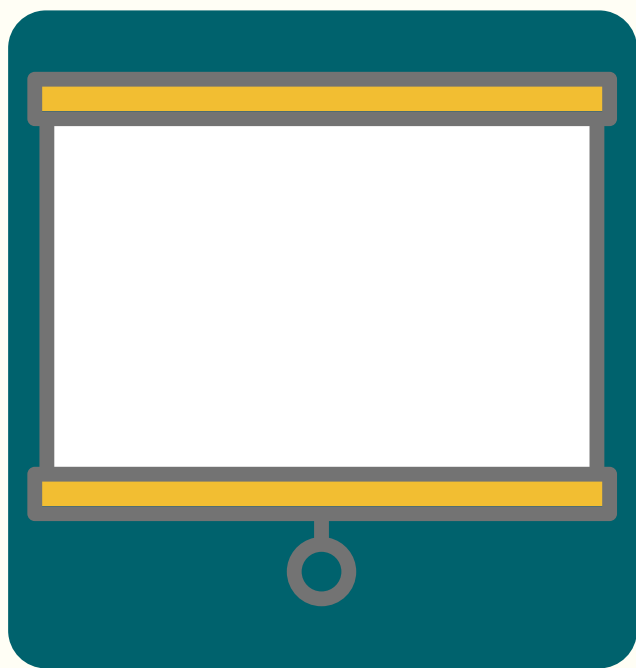


## Artists Collective Call for Submissions - EXTENDED

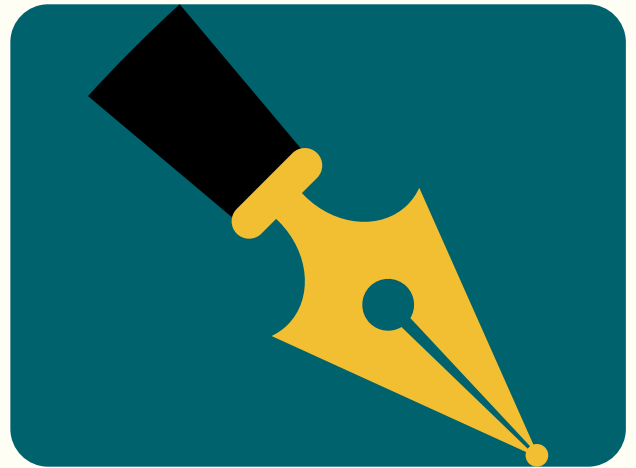


## Writers at Rutgers: Ilya Kaminsky
